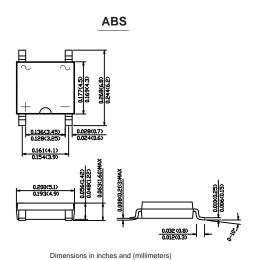

FIG.1 TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

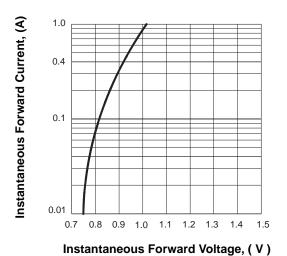


FIG.2 FORWARD DERATING CURVE

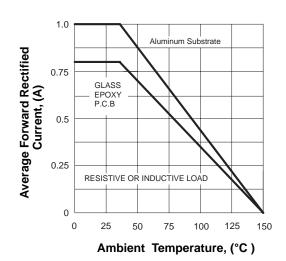
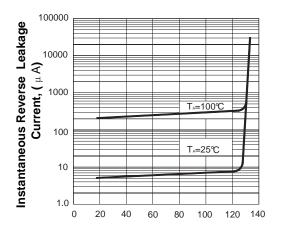
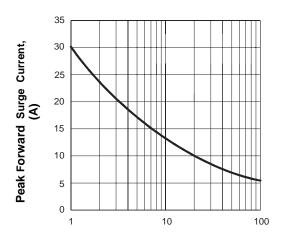


FIG.3 TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS
